

Grade point Averages on transcripts are based on a 4.0 scale:

- 2. Academic GPA for gradds 10-12
- 3. Weighted and unweighted GPA for all grades.

Post -Secondary Choices San Dimas H.S. Graduates

The San Dimas High School graduating class of 2023 consisted of 285 students. Of the 285, 277 graduating seniors participated in our senior exit survey. Based on their responses, upon graduation their plans were as follows:

49% planned to attend a community college
14% planned to attend a University of California school
9% planned to attend a California State University
7% planned to attend a California private school
7% planned to attend an out-of-state university
2% planned to join the armed services
4% planned to attend a trade school
2% planned to work full-time
5% were undecided.

76 seniors took the SAT Exam in 2023. The mean SAT
